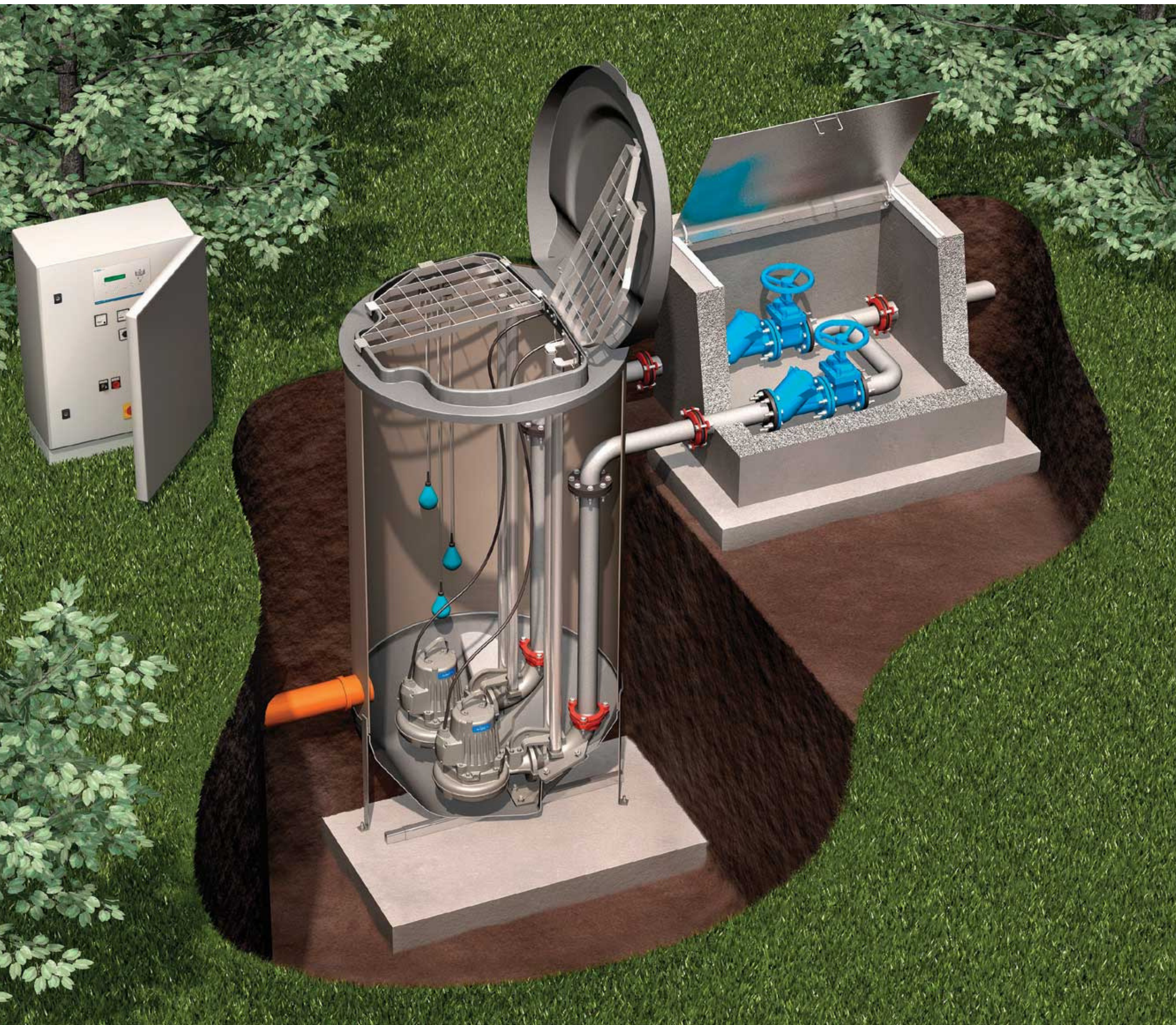




HOW TO LOOK AFTER YOUR PACKAGED PUMP STATION



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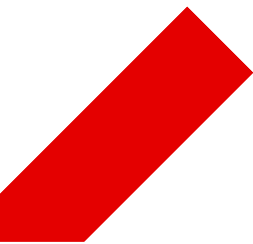
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WHAT DOES MY PUMP STATION — DO?

Pump stations are facilities including pumps and associated equipment, required for pumping fluids from one place to another.

They are used for a variety of applications, the most common being for the removal of sewage.

The likelihood is that your property is not connected directly to the mains sewer system and that is why you require a packaged pump station.

Sewage pump stations are designed to handle **foul water, sewage, natural human waste** and **biodegradable products**.



**WHAT WILL DAMAGE YOUR

WHAT WILL DAMAGE YOUR PUMP STATION:

Household waste and non-biodegradable products should **NEVER** be disposed of through the draining system.

Disposal of non bio-degradable products will affect the reliability of all pump stations, resulting in the pump (s) and storage chambers within the pumping station to become congested with non-pumpable waste.

Remember that it isn't only the toilet that is connected to your pump station! Anything that is poured down sink drains, the bath etc. all end up in the pump station.

**WHAT MUST NOT BE DISCHARGED
INTO THE DRAINS**

WHAT MUST NOT BE DISCHARGED — INTO THE DRAINS:

The following must not be discharged into the drains:

- Cleaning rags
 - Cloths
 - Syringes & Hypodermic needles
 - Medicines or any medical equipment. Unused medicines should be taken to a pharmacist for safe disposal
 - Fat, oil or grease. These tend to cool down, separate from water and coagulate within the pump station chamber. Causing blockages and failure of pumps.
 - Nappies, sanitary towels & incontinence materials
 - Even **some labelled 'disposable'** nappies and sanitary towels often **do not** degrade fully and can lead to malfunction. It is best to dispose of them by other means where possible.

HOW TO LOOK AFTER YOUR PUMP STATION:

Unfortunately, over time pump stations do accumulate settled solids & equipment wears.

It is good practice to regularly check if it is necessary to empty/ desludge your pump station.

Which we do during routine servicing.

You should look out for:

- Leaks

- Unusual Noises

-Pipes Backing Up

-Any Other Unexpected Behavior

&

Of course do not let rags or any other non-disposable materials into the system



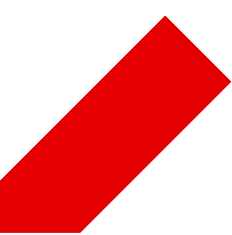
It is vital to regularly monitor your pumping stations on going operation.

This is likely to require mechanical and electrical servicing, which MUST be performed by highly trained personnel with experience in this field of work.

Regular servicing of pump stations and associated equipment will extend the life expectancy of your pumping station, efficiency and will reduce running costs.

It is far better to service your equipment than have your pumps fail and cause you huge disruption.

Check your station regularly and avoid unnecessary call outs!
